Player Conduct Agreement

As an athlete on a UConn Club Sports Team, I agree to follow the rules set forth by the UConn Club Sports Program, the Club Coaching Staff and the University Student Code of Conduct. I understand that breaking these rules may result in severe penalties, including probation from University funding, suspension and or expulsion from the club and/or the University of Connecticut. A Club Sports Team may also be held responsible for the acts of individual members.

- I understand that I represent UConn and that my conduct is a direct reflection on my teammates, school, coaches and the reputation of this club as a whole.
- I will not break any local, state or federal laws. **Regardless of age there will not be any alcohol in vehicles/ hotel rooms/ airplanes, etc while traveling for UConn Club Sports.**
- On the field, I will conduct myself with the highest level of sportsmanship. I will respect coaches, teammates, officials, opposing teams and the Club Sports Program Staff.
- I will follow any facility regulations applicable to the venue.
- I will not wear any Club Sport/Team apparel out to bars or other public events/areas while drinking.
- I will not place pictures on the web (i.e. Facebook, MySpace and/or personal team websites) that contain alcoholic beverages or the illusion of drinking.
- I will adhere to and follow applicable guidelines highlighted in *The Student Code*. *Some language from the student code has been highlighted below:*

As members of the University community, students have an obligation to uphold *The Student Code* as well as to obey federal, state, and local laws. The Director of Community Standards or designee shall make the final determination on what constitutes a potential violation of *The Student Code* and shall establish the specific charge(s) as appropriate.

The following list of behaviors is intended to represent the types of acts that constitute violations of *The Student Code*. This list should not be regarded as all-inclusive. All community members are responsible for knowing and observing all University policies and procedures.

1. Disruptive behavior which is defined as participating in or inciting others to participate in the disruption or obstruction of any University activity.
2. The threat of or actual physical assault or abuse; stalking; verbal/written abuse; threats, harassment, intimidation; and/or coercion, sexual misconduct and sexual assault and or unwelcome sexual contact.
3. Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person including one's self.
4. Hazing, defined as an act which endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student, or which destroys or removes public or private property for the purpose of initiation, admission into, affiliation with, or as a condition for continued membership in a group or organization. The express or implied consent of the victim will not be a defense. Apathy or acquiescence in the presence of hazing are not neutral acts; they are violations of this rule.
5. Use (including being under the influence), possession, sale, distribution, or manufacturing of controlled substances and/or drugs, or drug paraphernalia, except as expressly permitted by law and University regulations.
